A woman residing in a longterm care facility for about a year is in her room with a nurse when a volunteer, noticing her French name, speaks to her in that language. The nurse expresses amazement when the woman answers, saying that ever since the woman came to live in the home, it was thought that she couldn't talk since she never once answered when spoken to (in English).




