Title: Analyse des tendances migratoires au Québec entre 2001 et 2006 (The report is available in French only)

This study was conducted based on the 2006 census data and allows for analysis of migration trends in Québec. While most studies on migration make no distinction between the two official language groups in Canada, this study establishes the migration trends of Anglophones versus Francophones in Québec. It follows up on the studies that were just recently conducted for New Brunswick, Ontario, and Newfoundland and Labrador.

The authors summarized the outcomes of a survey consisting of three study components, i.e. educational aspirations of grade 12 students in French-language schools in Ontario, their intentions to pursue post-secondary studies in French and their intentions to pursue a career in their home region.

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Title: Petite enfance et autonomie culturelle Là où le nombre le justifie...V (The report is available in French only)

In this report based on the 2006 census data, the author discusses early childhood from a new viewpoint: cultural independence. As explained by the author in his text, cultural independence within a minority linguistic group consists in taking ownership of the environmental components that can contribute the most to its vitality or revitalization. He intends to demonstrate that early childhood is an influencing and deciding factor in the vitality of Francophone and Acadian communities and that it forms the very foundation of cultural independence.
